Answering the Call: Chaplain Andrew Matthews serving Carolina Beach PD

of Emergency Chaplains—is there.

Through his ministry, Andrew lives out our mission:

building caring relationships with the hope of gaining permission to share the life-changing good news of Jesus Christ in a non-threatening manner. Whether it's comforting a grieving family or standing with officers who carry a heavy, unseen load, Andrew brings compassion, calm, and the hope of Christ to every call. He doesn't offer easy answers. He offers presence. Prayer. Hope.

This summer, Carolina Beach is packed with visitors, and with that comes an even greater weight on local first responders. Please pray for Chaplain Matthews as he ministers to officers who are stretched thin and as he responds to the crises that often come with vacation season.

CHAPLAIN FIELD REPORTS

Family Tragedy—Two chaplains were dispatched to the scene of a domestic homicide where a woman was fatally shot by a family member. Her 7-year-old son witnessed the tragedy. Chaplains provided initial care to the child and grieving relatives at the scene. However, during the response, a family member abruptly removed the child from the scene, and left without further contact. Please join us in praying for this young boy and the many lives affected by this heartbreaking situation.

Spreading the Word About Chaplaincy—Over the past month, our office team has been busy promoting the ministry of chaplaincy throughout North Carolina. We've mailed letters to every public safety agency and hundreds of churches—and followed up with phone calls to arrange opportunities to speak about the work of Emergency Chaplains. Already, several churches have invited us to share what God is doing through this ministry. If your church would like to schedule a visit, we'd love to hear from you!

Suicide Prevention Training—One of our chaplains took part in a specialized training session at the NC Highway Patrol Training Center, hosted by the NC Law

Enforcement Assistance Program. The training focused on recognizing signs of suicidal ideation and explored best practices for suicide prevention, intervention, and postvention within the law enforcement community.

Ministry to Grieving Mother—A chaplain responded to a home where a woman had discovered her daughter had died unexpectedly. With no nearby family, the chaplain assisted in contacting out-of-town relatives and helped coordinate arrangements with a local funeral home. They remained with the mother for several hours, offering emotional and spiritual support, and ensured she would not be left alone in the aftermath of the tragedy.

4-Year-Old Dies of Gunshot Wound—Three chaplains were dispatched following a tragic incident involving a child who sustained a self-inflicted gunshot wound after finding a firearm in a backpack. One chaplain responded to the scene, while two others went directly to the hospital to support the family. Several adults and at least one other child were present in the home when the incident occurred. Chaplains provided emotional and spiritual care to those impacted by the tragedy, including family members and first responders.
