Chaplain Field Reports

CHAPLAIN REQUESTED TO a scene where a man died from apparent drug overdose. Chaplains provided care for family, who started CPR on the patient. Our Chaplains were able to pray with the family before clearing the scene.

THREE CHAPLAINS RESPONDED to a homicide scene at McDougald Terrace in Durham. The Chaplains ministered to family members and bystanders for three hours.

ACTIVE SHOOTER: A domestic situation ended in murder/suicide at a workplace. Four Chaplains reported to the staging area to minister to over fifty employees that had been evacuated from the building.

HOMOCIDE INVESTIGATORS requested Chaplain to respond for early morning death of 3 month old under suspicious circumstances. Chaplain ministered to family members gathered on scene.

A WORLD WAR II VETERAN drove himself to breakfast a few days before Thanksgiving. His family members found him unresponsive in his car shortly after he returned home. Chaplains arrived and comforted the family during resuscitation efforts and later assisted them in contacting their funeral home.

REQUEST FOR CHAPLAIN on scene where a teenager had committed suicide. Chaplain provided on scene care for parents of the deceased until the body was taken to the Medical Examiner's office in Raleigh for an autopsy.

A MAN WENT INTO CARDIAC ARREST while attending a party at a friends house. His friends started CPR and called 9-1-1. Resuscitation efforts were not successful. Two Chaplains ministered to friends and helped family on scene with funeral home arrangements. Follow up grief counseling resources were offered to both friends and family.
