CHAPLAIN JERRY—SAVING LIVES IN YADKIN COUNTY

Emergency Chaplains is conducting a special fundraiser to purchase an Automated External Defibrillator (AED).

According to the American Red Cross, an AED is used to help those experiencing sudden cardiac arrest. It's a sophisticated, yet easy-to-use, medical device that can analyze the heart's rhythm and, if necessary, deliver an electrical shock, or defibrillation, to help the heart reestablish an effective rhythm.

Once EChap is able to purchase this AED, it will be donated to Chaplain Jerry McFadyen. He is a member of the Yadkin County Rescue Squad where he functions as a NC Licensed Emergency Medical Responder and is trained in the use of AEDs and CPR.

Like many rural counties, Yadkin is dotted with several small towns and communities. Response time for paramedics is often extended because of the distance they have to cover. Having another mobile AED in the county in the hands of a trained Rescue Squad member, could be the difference needed to save a life one day. Will you help us raise the \$4,000 needed to purchase a professional LIFEPAK AED kit that Chaplain McFadyen can put into service in Yadkin County?

CHAPLAIN FIELD REPORTS

After a pedestrian was struck and killed by a dump truck, EMS requested a chaplain to respond. During the three hours that law enforcement investigated the accident, the chaplain provided care for family members that came to the scene.

Law enforcement summoned our chaplains to a homicide scene after

two teenage males were found dead in the woods. Six chaplains assisted on the scene where family and friends gathered while law enforcement investigated. Chaplains were on scene for over seven hours, until the investigation was complete

A resident of a local nursing and rehabilitation facility was attacked with a knife by his roommate. The attacker was arrested and the victim was transported to the hospital with critical injuries. The facility requested assistance from EChap due to the emotionally traumatic impact on both the residents and the staff. Five chaplains deployed to provide on-site debriefing and served thirty-five individuals. Chaplains continue to provide follow up care on a weekly basis. *****
