CHAPLAIN FIELD REPORTS

On Sunday, June 4th, our Crisis Response Team in Durham responded to a call that involved a 7-year-old boy, Kamari Munerlyn, who had been shot while riding in a vehicle. Our chaplains responded to the scene, to the hospital, to the 9-1-1 Center and to the police substation in that area.

Despite the valiant efforts of our police officers, firefighters and medics, Kamari was pronounced dead shortly after his arrival at Duke Hospital.

Our chaplains were present with the family at the hospital and made sure that the hospital chaplains were fully informed of the situation so they could minister to the family members there. Once care for the family had been established, our chaplains turned their attention to caring for the first responders over the next several hours.

PERSON COUNTY CRT

A Crisis Response Team (CRT) is being formed to serve the agencies and citizens in Person County. The targeted start date for the team is September 1, 2017.

Emergency Chaplains currently provides chaplains in Person County who serve Person EMS, Roxboro Police, Person 911, Timberlake VFD and Moriah VFD. Those chaplains are assigned to minister to the needs of the members of those agencies.

The addition of a CRT in Person County will provide at least one chaplain to be on call at all times to respond with law enforcement, fire and EMS. Working side-by-side with responders, CRT chaplains will provide assistance to citizens who are facing a crisis. Most of the calls the Person CRT will respond to will likely involve sudden and unexpected death.
